

IT'S MOWING SEASON Mr. Woodry would like to remind everyone that it's time to get ready to begin mowing SUMC's cemetery again. All scouts are allowed to operate mowers with parent permission and presence at our mowings. Watch for signup sheets in the coming weeks. MEDICAL FORMS UPDATE E-mails were sent to all parents this past week with reminders to get your scout medical forms updated if they are more than a year old. Forms A and B1-B2 are needed for all activities, while Form C will be needed for summer camp. Form C requires a doctor's signature. Any adults attending camp will also need Forms A and B1-B2. If staying more than 72 hours then Form C will also be needed.

CAMPING HACKS

Prepare some of your camping food ahead of time for less mess and to save time in camp! Having scrambled eggs or pancakes? Bring the pre-scrambled eggs or pancake batter in a squeezable plastic bottle.

Save pack space by using a sleeping bag sack or a pillowcase filled with your clothes as a pillow.

Doritos, Fritos, and potato chips can be used as firestarters if necessary. The oils and fats in these chips will cause them to burn if you are desperate and having trouble starting your fire.

Carry a small pencil sharpener with your firestarters. Use it on small pencil-sized sticks. The shavings make great tinder!
