REQUIRED BEFORE ARRIVAL

	Permission Slips — required for each campout; found on Troop Site under Scout & Parent Resources → Permission Slips
	Medical Form Part A & B — required annually; found on Troop Site under Scout & Parent Resources → Medical Forms

IMPORTANT

	NO COTTON — does not retain heat when wet; dries slowly
	Dress in layers — underwear → base layer → shirt/pants → mid layer → jacket
	Be prepared for changing weather conditions

UNIFORM

	Class A Uniform — required for camporees — shirt, pants/shorts, belt, neckerchief w/ slide

CLOTHING

<i>Packing Tip :</i> Use Ziploc bags to organize clothing and keep items dry

UNDER / NEXT-TO-SKIN

	3–4 Underwear (non-cotton)
	3 Liner Socks (non-cotton) — worn under hiking socks to reduce friction and prevent blisters
	3 Hiking Socks (wool/synthetic, non-cotton) — wicks moisture and prevents blisters

DAILY CLOTHING

	1–2 Base Layer Top (non-cotton, optional) — for cooler mornings or nights
	1–2 Base Layer Bottom (non-cotton, optional) — for cooler mornings or nights
	2–3 Shirts (short or long sleeve, non-cotton)
	1–2 Pants (non-cotton, optional) — hiking or athletic
	2–3 Shorts (non-cotton)
	1 Sleepwear — dry clothes only for sleeping; do not wear daytime layers
	1 Bathing Suit (optional)

WARMTH / OUTER LAYERS

	1 Light Mid Layer (non-cotton) — hoodie/fleece/sweatshirt; for cooler mornings or nights
	1 Rain Jacket — must be waterproof
	1 Rain Pants — must be waterproof
	1 Hat with brim — sun protection
	1–2 Gloves — optional; light only if cooler temps expected

FOOTWEAR

	1 Pair Hiking Boots — broken in
	1 Camp Shoes — lightweight / breathable (required)
	1 Pair Water Shoes (required for water outings) — water socks, sandals, or similar

PACKS / BAGS

	Hiking Backpack — internal or external frame, 65–75L
	Day Pack — small backpack for essentials during outings
	Ziploc Bags — use as needed; pack clothing inside for organization and moisture protection
	Stuff Sacks / Packing Cubes — optional; for organization

SLEEPING GEAR

	Sleeping Bag (40°F or higher) — required
	Sleeping Pad — R-value appropriate for temperature; provides insulation and comfort
	Pillow (optional) — small, compressible, or inflatable

CAMP GEAR

	Mess Kit — plate/bowl, utensils, and cup; no glass
	Water Bottle (32 oz+) — no glass
	Headlamp — with extra batteries
	Camp Chair — compact / foldable

PERSONAL ITEMS

	Toothbrush & Toothpaste
	Deodorant
	Camp Towel — small
	Sunscreen (optional)
	Bug Repellent (optional)

SCOUT GEAR

	Pocket Knife — if you earned your Totin' Chip
	Compass
	Fire Starter Kit — optional
	Scout Book — optional; work on requirements during downtime
